SECTION IV - HEALTH HAZARD AND FIRST AID INFORMATION

OCCUPATIONAL EXPOSURE LIMIT: Not established.

PRIMARY ROUTES OF ENTRY: Skin, inhalation.

Can cause temporary irritation, tearing and blurred vision.	EYES	Immediately flush with large amounts of water for at least 15 minutes. If irritation persists, get medical attention.
Can cause a burning sensation on more sensitive areas (face, eyes, mouth).	SKIN	Immediately flush affected areas with water. Remove contaminated clothing and wash affected areas with soap and water. Apply a vitamin E cream (or vegetable oil) to the affected areas. If irritation persists for 3-4 hours, get medical attention.

Excessive inhalation can cause nasal and respiratory irritation, nausea and nervous system disorders, such as fatigue, dizziness, headaches, lack of coordination, tremors and unconsciousness.

INHALATION Remove affected person to fresh air. Give oxygen, if necessary. If breathing has stopped, administer artificial respiration and get medical attention immediately.

Can cause stomach irritation, resulting in nausea, cramps and vomiting. Can also cause nervous system disorders, such as fatigue, dizziness, headaches, lack of coordination, tremors and unconsciousness.
